Abstract: Despite being the largest means-tested federal program in the U.S., there is sparse evidence on the intensive margin labor supply impact of SNAP in recent years. Labor supply theory predicts that participation in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) will create disincentives to work across the intensive and extensive margin. Leveraging quasi-experimental variation in local purchasing power of SNAP, I investigate the impact of geographic variation in SNAP purchasing power on participants labor supply decisions. Although SNAP benefits are standardized across the United States, geographical variation in food prices creates substantial variation in the real value or purchasing power of SNAP benefits. Consistent with standard labor supply theory, I find strong evidence of labor supply disincentives especially across the intensive margin. The magnitude of response varies across demographic groups such as single mothers and hourly wage workers indicating substantial preference heterogeneity. Quantifying post-transfer behavioral changes in labor supply for heterogeneous groups reveals unique preferences which can guide optimal policy design of transfer programs especially in the contexts of local economic conditions.
