Scheduling your courses: Most 2000-level courses are introductory or survey courses, often based on lectures, tests, introductory readings and/or a textbook. On the other hand, 3000-level and 4000-level courses generally have more substantial and challenging readings and are often based on seminar discussions and research papers. Please consider the workload when devising your schedule. Pair up lower-level courses with upper-level ones to have a balanced and well-manageable schedule.
