CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

The Stuart and Suzanne Grant Center for the American Jewish Experience invites applications for the 2022-2023 Margolies Student-Faculty Research Award.

The Stuart and Suzanne Grant Center for the American Jewish Experience is a hub of boundary-breaking scholarship that explores the complexity of American Jewry by diversifying topics, approaches, and contributors. The Grant Center contributes richness to the field of American Jewish studies by supporting experimentative, collaborative and interdisciplinary research at the intersections of history, literature, cultural studies, sociology and other disciplines.

The Margolies Student-Faculty Research Award supports research in American Jewish Studies. For the 2022-2023 academic year, the Margolies Award will be available to Tulane students only. Students applying for a Student-Faculty Research should be majors or minors in Jewish Studies, or be proposing research that focuses significantly on the American Jewish Experience, broadly conceived (inclusive of North, South, and Central America and the Caribbean). The application should include the support of a Faculty mentor. The maximum award for 2022-2023 will be \$1000.

GUIDELINES

Proposal Please describe your research project, including any preparations you have undertaken (including coursework). Make sure to describe how your project fits into the broader landscape of the American Jewish experience. Indicate whether the project is part of a larger project, including a capstone or thesis, and any particular methodologies you will use. If your

research will require travel or utilize any archives, please be sure to explain in detail why these locations are necessary for your research.

Faculty letter A one-page letter should from your proposed Faculty mentor. Your mentor can be in any department; the letter should speak to their support of your research and their willingness to guide you through the research process. Please ask your faculty mentor to email their letter to the Grant Center at grantcenter@tulane.edu by the application deadline.
