Why did the "Renaissance" begin to flourish first in Italy? What was new in the Renaissance? What changes in the make and reception of art occurred in this period?

This course introduces students to the study of the visual culture of Renaissance Italy (c. 1350–1550). We will analyze painting, sculpture, architecture, drawings & prints, and decorative arts,

using diverse art historical methods. Special use will be made of primary sources, specifically artists' writings. Major figures to be studied include: Giotto, Ghiberti, Donatello, Masaccio, Leonardo da Vinci, Michelangelo, and Raphael.
