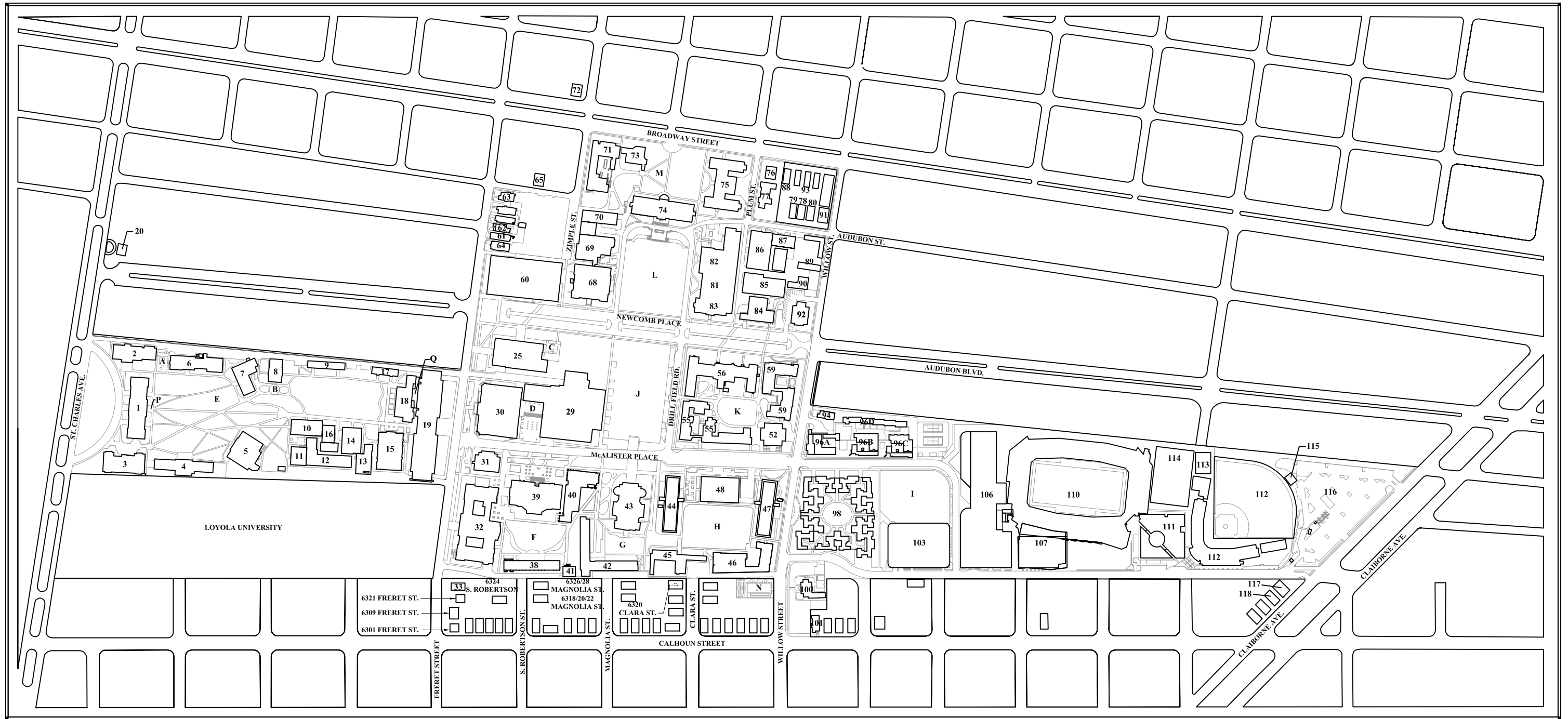

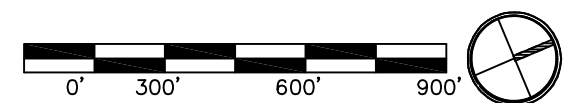

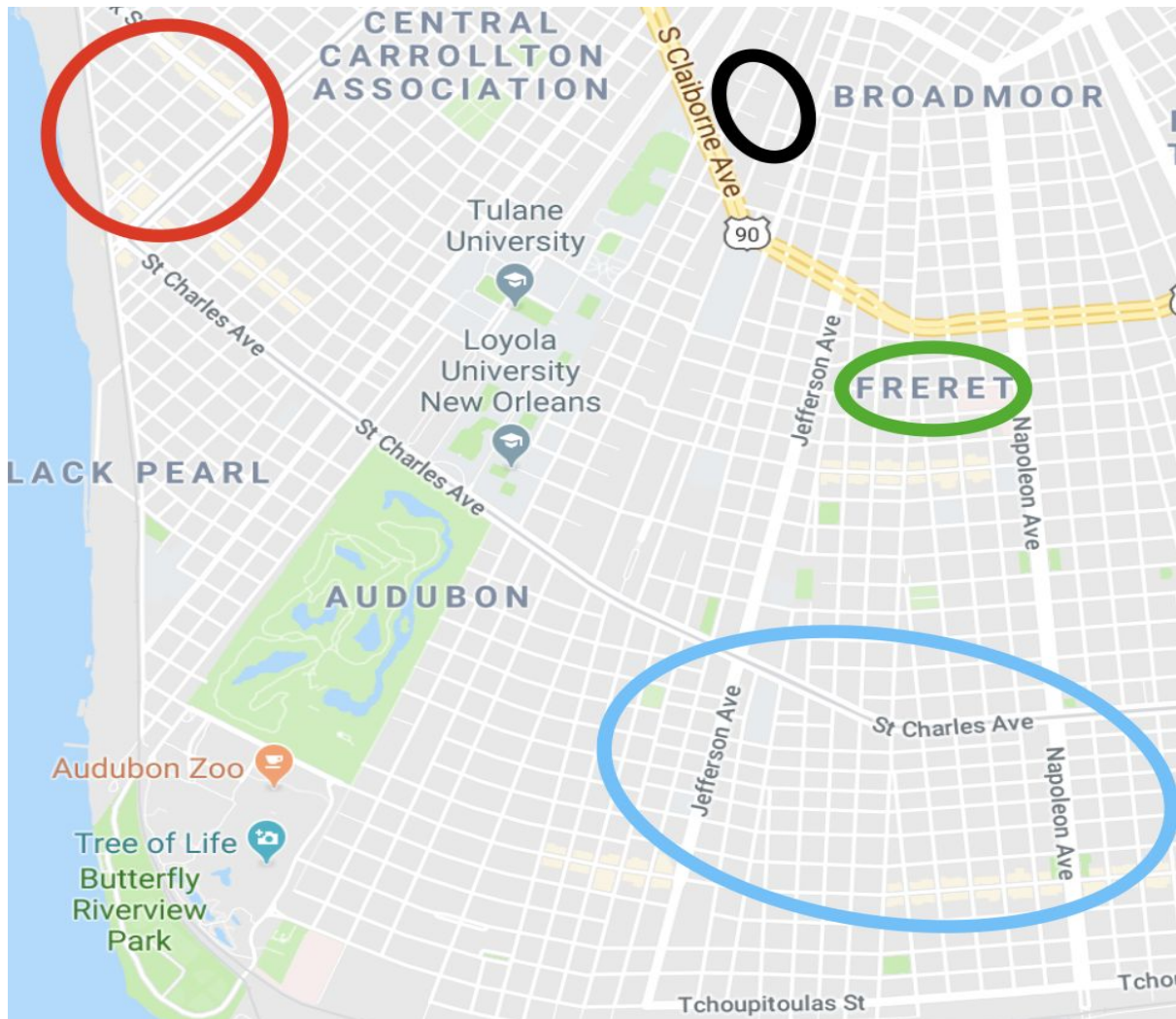

Food on campus can be found in the LBC and there are several PJ's Coffee shops located within a few blocks of us as well. Additionally, some of our favorite places in the city can be found close to Tulane's campus. Here are a few of the highlights:

Coffee Shops

Petite Rouge Coffee \$ - Fast Service, casual, great coffee.

Re de la Course \$ - Espresso drinks, bagel sandwiches & pastries served in a stately former bank building.

Mojo Coffee House \$ - Small Batch coffee roaster located in New Orleans.

French Truck Coffee \$ - Industrial-chic hangout for fresh-roasted java drinks & light bites amid modern decor.

Restaurants

MCP Uptown \$\$ - Pizza (including by the slice), salads, and sandwiches. No Dine-In.

Moe's BBQ \$\$ - Easygoing chain serving Alabama-style pulled pork & other smoked meats.

Ted's Frostop \$ - Breakfast, burgers, shakes, and daily specials.

Camellia Grill \$ - Fabled institution for diner fare, great late-night food.

Jacques-Imo's \$\$ - Quirky, mural-lined hotspot with Creole soul food; expect a wait.

Ba Chi Canteen \$\$ - Vietnamese noodle house with pho, soft shell "bacos" & vegetarian dishes.

Dat Dog \$ - Colorful local chain featuring hot dogs, veggie dogs & sausages, plus fries & shakes.

Wayfare \$\$ - Innovative takes on sandwiches, plus charcuterie, cheese & custom cocktails.

Bearcat Cafe \$\$ - Breezy cafe with an eclectic menu, plus artisanal coffee & bottled teas.

Superior Seafood \$\$ - Seafood-focused Creole fare in a sunny space with St. Charles Ave views.

Tal's Hummus \$ - Hummus, kebabs, falafel & more (with many vegetarian options).

Shaya \$\$\$ - Israeli cuisine gets a Southern spin at this award-winning Uptown eatery

Late-Night (21+)

Bruno's Tavern \$ - Neighborhood Sports Bar with draft beers and pub snacks (21+).

Ale \$\$ - Craft beer served with creative pub food at this hip tavern (21+).

Cure \$\$ - Firehouse turned stylish, dimly lit cocktail lounge with creative drinks & eclectic array of dishes.

The Bulldog \$ - Beer tavern with more than 50 beers on tap, 100 more in bottles, & pub grub.

If you are looking for something active to do on Saturday morning, there is a free [Jazz Yoga](#) class in the French Quarter, next to the French Market and close to the river.
