<i>À bientôt!</i> [a.bjɛ̃.to]	See you soon!
<i>À la prochaine!</i> [a.la.pʁɔ.ʃɛn]	See you next time!
<i>À demain!</i> [a.də.mɛ̃]	See you tomorrow!
<i>Bonne journée!</i> [bɔn.ʒuʁ.ne]	Have a good day!
<i>Bonne soirée!</i> [bɔn. swa. vɛ]	Have a good evening/night!

What's your name? (formal)

Comment tu t'appelles?

What's your name? (informal)

Comment ça s'écrit?
[kɔ.mɑ̃.sa.se.kʁi]

How do you spell it?

Nice to meet you! (if a man says it)

Enchantée!

Nice to meet you! (if a woman says it)

NOTES

- There is a difference between formal and informal expressions: make sure to memorize them.
- *Ça va* (lit. that goes) can be used both as a question *Ça va?* 'how are you?' and an answer *Ça va!* 'I'm well'
- *À tout à l'heure* 'see you later/soon/in a bit while' is only used if you plan on seeing your interlocutor again later that day
- The most neutral way of saying 'thanks/thank you' is *merci. Je vous remercie/je te remercie* is emphatic
- The accent (^) on *s'il te plaît/s'il vous plaît* is optional: there was a reformation of spelling in 1990 and the new forms are written without an accent (*s'il te plait/s'il vous plait*)
- The most neutral way of saying 'you're welcome' is *de rien. Je vous en prie/je t'en prie* is emphatic. You can also use *Je vous en prie/je t'en prie* to say 'please' when you let someone pass you or enter a building or a room.
- *Moi, c'est* can be used instead of *Je m'appelle* as an equivalent of 'I'm' in English.
- When writing, women need to add an 'e' to *Enchanté!*
